

Significant trees on public land – Nomination form

Council is seeking to compile a register of significant trees on public land to assist in managing these into the future, in accordance with Council's Management of Trees on Public Land Policy.

A tree may be significant because:

- Of its age (it may be an early settler planting or represent pre-European settlement).
- It may be commemorative (e.g. of an event, organisation or person).
- Botanical rarity (e.g. be uncommon in this area).
- As a landmark.
- As a very fine example of its species.
- As part of a remnant landscape (e.g. associated with a building no longer there).

At this stage, we are seeking nominations/suggestions for trees located on public land, such as:

- Road verges.
- Parks and reserves.
- Recreation grounds.
- Nature strips
- Associated with Council buildings (e.g. halls).

At this stage we are not compiling a register of significant trees on private land, however if you would like to nominate a tree on your property, please do so, and we will hold that information for reference.
