

ANIMAL MANAGEMENT RESTRICTED BREED LEGISLATION

On the 1st of July 2010, changes to the *Dog Control Act of 2000* were proclaimed and officially became the new State laws.

There were a number of amendments to the *Act* however the implementation of **Restricted Breed Legislation** is one major area that came into effect.

The following dog breeds must comply with the new legislation;

- American Pit Bull or Pit Bull Terrier
- Dogo Argentino
- Fila Brasileiro
- Japanese Tosa
- Perro de Presa Canario or Presa Canario

If the dog is registered, listed or recognised as one of these breeds or types it will now be declared under the *Act* as a Restricted Breed dog.

The owners or person in charge of a restricted breed dog must ensure that;

- The dog is desexed
- It is implanted with an approved microchip
- The dog is on lead and muzzled when in a public place
- The dog wears an approved restricted breed collar at all times
- The premises where the dog is kept displays the approved restricted breed warning signs on every entrance
